ARE YOU WORRIED ABOUT A CHILD IN REDBRIDGE?



Below is a 'quick reference' guide for identifying need and making a referral, if you are worried about a child. Full information is available in the RSCB Multi-Agency Threshold Document, published in September 2018. This includes examples of need at the different levels. It also includes guidance on seeking consent to a referral from parents or carers, and when a referral might be made without

consent.
