

Safeguarding Refugee and Vulnerable Migrant Children

Background

Asylum seekers are some of the most vulnerable people in society and they can sometimes be misrepresented in the media.

The UK asylum process is complex, which can make it a difficult system to understand and in November 2017 the Government published a [strategy](#) on working with unaccompanied minors and refugee children.

This half day course aims to support professionals to improve their capacities to contribute to safeguarding good outcomes for children and young people from families who have sought refuge.

Learning Outcomes

This course will enable practitioners in the following areas:

- To identify the distinction between refugees, asylum seekers and other migrants.
- To address the misconceptions regarding asylum seekers and refugees.
- Understand the different protection/leave statuses in the UK and what they mean.
- To understand the multi-agency assessment and responses needed to safeguard children and young people affected.
