Background

The online world opens up immense opportunities for children and young people. It is integral to modern day youth culture. It also, however, carries many threats. This course aims to equip staff with an understanding of what the risks are and how to prevent, recognise and respond to them.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the training, participants will:

- Understand how to minimize the risk to children using technology
- Have an understanding of modern day use of technology and the context in which children and young people use it
- Have developed an awareness of the risks involved
- Have developed an awareness and understanding of the legislative context for safeguarding children in a digital world
- Know elements of good practice to keep children safe when using technology
- Understand the concept and risks of online bullying and its impact on children and young people
- Have developed an understanding of how predators use technology
- Understand when and how to share information, paying attention to the legislative requirements, including developing an understanding of the [Data Protection Act 2018](#), [Human Rights Act 1998](#), and common law duty
- Understand the role and remit of staff in different services
