Working Together 2018 states A designated practitioner.... Their role is to support other practitioners in their organisations and agencies to recognise the needs of children, including protection from possible abuse or neglect. Designated practitioner roles should always be explicitly defined in job descriptions. Practitioners should be given sufficient time, funding, supervision, and support to fulfil their child welfare and safeguarding responsibilities effectively

How could safeguarding supervision benefit me? It offers you a space to; discuss and seek guidance on specific cases, ranging from Looked after Children, Child Protection and Child in Need to Early Help, CAF and emerging concerns, provides support and constructive challenge around safeguarding practice, allows for issues arising in the workplace to be processed, is trauma informed and reflective, provides support around emotional wellbeing and resilience, reflects on achievements and areas of good practice, supports DSLs and their teams to upskill colleagues with ideas for trainings and briefings.

Who provides the supervision?
