

Attending Child Protection Conferences and Making Plans with the Strengthening Families Approach

Background

Recognising that working in partnership with families and multi-agency planning is paramount to the effectiveness of protecting children and assessing and providing for their needs. A Child Protection Conference is a multi-agency meeting to decide if children are at risk of significant harm and if so to recommend a Child Protection Plan. Using a Strengthening Families Approach, this one-day course is for all practitioners and managers who may be required to attend a Child Protection Conference. It will be particularly beneficial to those who are developing their experience in this area.

Learning Objectives

By the end of the course participants will:

- Develop skills to be able to contribute to effective outcome focused planning to safeguard children
- Understand their individual roles as part of the conference and Core Group and how to contribute effectively
- Know the required preparation needed for attending a Strengthening Families model of conferencing
- To use a Strengthening Families Approach to confidently describe the safeguarding needs of children and young people including those from culturally and racially diverse backgrounds.
