

Young Women and Girls Affected by 'Gangs' and County Lines



Background

Figures from the Children's Commissioner for England suggest that girls account for as many as 34% of the 6,830 children aged under 17 in England assessed by councils as being involved in gangs. Girls caught up in gangs are at risk of both criminal and sexual exploitation
