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Training Policy



The training courses in this programme have been identified through training needs assessment and help support RSCP priorities for 2025/26. These priorities are derived from a number of sources, including: Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews (CSPRs); responses to current and national developments; and feedback from children, young people, families and carers.

Principles of RSCP Training

Our programme is based on principles to ensure that training is:

- Child centred and incorporates and promotes children's rights, the child's voice, and ensures that their welfare is treated as paramount.
- Incorporates equal opportunities and antioppressive practice and reflects the diversity of the communities served.
- Promotes and places the child within the family and recognises the need for working together and in partnership with parents and carers.
- Multi-agency and promotes the need for interagency working to safeguard children from harm.
- Evidence-based and incorporates learning from research, and service user participation.
- Incorporating and supporting a variety of learning styles including experiential and reflection.

Audiences

Safeguarding children and young people is everyone's business, which means that audiences are large and diverse. This includes the whole of the children and young people's workforce and those working with their parents or carers across all sectors and disciplines.

The courses on this training programme are only available to those who work with children and families *predominantly or exclusively* in the London Borough of Redbridge.

Quality Assurance and Evaluation of Impact

Our training is quality assured in-line with the above principles agreed within our <u>Framework and Principles for Safeguarding Children Training.</u>

If you attend one of our training events, you'll be asked to complete an online evaluation and you'll receive your certificate of attendance after completing it.

Each course will offer resources and ideas to 'transfer' learning to your teams and cascade throughout your organisation. You may also find an observer accessing your course, undertaking an independent evaluation.

We will follow up targeted courses by contacting participants to establish the impact of the training we deliver on practice and outcomes for children, young people and families.

Notes for Training Attendees and Managers



Learners: Please discuss and agree your attendance with your line manager (or appropriate individual if you are the line manager); you'll need to give us their details on the <u>online</u> <u>booking form</u>. Please ensure the training is appropriate to your role. Make sure you're free to attend the course applied for **in full** before booking.

Managers: Before agreeing a booking, please ensure you discuss the content of the course with the learner, how it will be applied in the workplace and its suitability for the learner in their role. You'll be copied into the email booking confirmation and certificate of attendance for your information. Please make a note of the date in your diary and consider a substitute to cover any unexpected absence or staff departure, as there is a charge for late cancellations. We don't make exceptions to this for any operational reasons. Following the training, you may be asked how the training has contributed to practice and outcomes.

Fees: Our course fees are £65 per 'full day' and £35 per 'half day' training course in the classroom, and £65 per 'long' and £35 per 'short' training course online. The course fee for each course is payable by all except those working or volunteering for charities and will be invoiced using the billing details on the booking 5 working days before the training. The page relating to each event in the programme details what type of event it is. There is no course fee for places on events described as 'free courses' but one will be charged for non-attendance. No charges apply for free briefings.

Cancellation Policy:

- We only accept cancellations made in writing to <u>redbridgescp.training@redbridge.gov.uk</u> more than 5 working days before the day of the course (not including the day of the course). We will confirm all such cancellations in writing, usually within 3 working days.
- All other cancellations will be considered to be nonattendance and will not be eligible for a refund. The only exception to this is sickness on the day of the training, provided we are informed in writing (to the above email address), no later than the day of the course, by the learner's line manager or appropriate individual.
- If for any reason an organisation wishes to change the name on the booking, we must be informed of the name and email address of the new attendee, and who they are replacing, ahead of the course, using the email address above.

Non-attendance:

- If a place is booked and the learner does not attend, they will not be eligible for a refund. In addition, please note the following:
- Non-attendance at free courses will incur a course fee.
- Any non-attendance by those working or volunteering for a charity will incur a course fee.
- Course fees incurred due to non-attendance will be invoiced using the billing details on the booking after the training course.



What to expect from us:

- We'll send you confirmation of your booking by email (normally within three working days of receipt of your booking form), confirming the date, times, title and venue of the course, and the terms and conditions of the booking. If you don't receive a booking confirmation from us, you don't have a booking.
- Your booking confirmation will include a calendar entry attachment so you can add the date to your calendar.
- We'll send you another email, usually one week before the course, with a link to the training event (if it's online) and any pre-course reading materials you may need.
- For classroom training, we'll provide plenty of water and cups but we won't be able to provide any other refreshments.
- We monitor participation in our online courses. If you
 miss more than 15 minutes of the course, we will not be
 able to certificate your attendance or provide a refund.

What we expect from you (online):

- You will need to have a computer with a working internet connection, internet browser, microphone and webcam to take part. Please make sure your equipment is working properly.
- We require attendees to have their camera turned on throughout the training. Our online training is a virtual classroom and we expect attendees to be present and participating throughout. If you need to turn your camera off for any reason, please flag this in the chat.
- Our training should only be accessed in a suitable environment, such as a quiet part of an office, or a home office where you will not be disturbed by others.

 Safeguarding is a sensitive topic and participants must be in an environment where it can be discussed freely.
 Participants trying to join from a public place may be turned away.

What we expect from you (all courses):

- Part of your responsibility when attending training is to provide feedback. We'll send you a link to our online feedback form after your course. Upon receipt of your completed form, we'll send your certificate of attendance and any materials related to the course to help with your training transfer. A limit of three months to complete this applies.
- If we send any pre-course reading materials, we expect anyone joining the course to have read them prior to attendance.
- Prompt attendance is required by the 'Start' time indicated in your booking confirmation (we recommend joining the training at the 'Registration' time). The session will be locked to new attendees 15 minutes after the start time. Anyone who misses the course due to lateness will be turned away and will not be eligible for a refund.
- If you cannot attend the full course, this must be agreed in advance, in writing, by the RSCP. Any early departures not agreed in advance with the RSCP will be considered nonattendance and will not be eligible for a certificate of attendance or a refund.

What training should I attend?



Your employer is responsible for ensuring staff and volunteers receive basic training to raise awareness of safeguarding (often known as **Level 1**). They may also offer additional 'inhouse' safeguarding training specific to your responsibilities and setting.

This Programme provides multi-agency training at Levels 2 and 3, as outlined in the London Safeguarding Children Partnership Training Competency Framework. It supports the skills and knowledge needed to work effectively within existing guidance and procedures, such as Working Together to Safeguard Children 2023, the Intercollegiate Document, 2019 for competences in healthcare and the London Child Protection Procedures.

Level 2 Training should be attended by practitioners who work predominantly, or have intensive but irregular contact, with children, young people and/or parents/carers.

Level 3 Training is more advanced and learners will have particular specialist child protection responsibilities which may include being a 'designated lead' in their agency for child protection.

Examples of safeguarding responsibilities and professional competence

London SCP Training Level 2

- Working together to identify, assess and meet the needs of children where there are safeguarding concerns
- To identify child focused interventions and measurable outcomes
- Understanding the possible impact of parenting difficulties on parenting capacity.
- Recognising the importance of family history and functioning.
- Working with children and family members, including addressing lack of co-operation and superficial compliance.

London SCP Training Level 3

- Attending Child Protection Conferences and managing Core Groups; roles, responsibilities and collaborative practice.
- Using professional judgements to make decisions as to whether a child is suffering, or is likely to suffer, significant harm.
- Working with complexity.
- Taking emergency action or intervention.
- Promoting effective, professional practice.
- Supervising child protection cases and advising other professionals.



Part One:

Understanding Safeguarding Risks and Responding to Learning

Learning within our programme has been developed through ongoing training needs analysis carried out at a local level by the Training Subgroup of the RSCP and draws on feedback from our multi-agency learners.

This section of our programme contains courses on a range of risks faced by children, using lessons learned from incidences of significant harm found in the Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel: annual report 2023 to 2024

It features key learning on those children most vulnerable to harm and links to the local services and practitioners supporting early intervention and support for families.

Domestic Abuse and Safeguarding Children



Background Level 2

The trauma that children experience when they witness domestic violence in the home plays a major role in their development and physical well-being, effects of which can last into adulthood. The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 recognises children as victims of domestic abuse rather than witnesses.

Domestic abuse can also be a sign that children are suffering another type of abuse or neglect.

Learning Outcomes

At the end of this training participants will be able to:

- Define domestic abuse considering its breadth and manifestations
- Identify the impact of the intersection of multiple identities and circumstances on those who experience domestic abuse
- Link the effects of domestic abuse on a child's welfare and development.
- Use relevant knowledge in effective engagement with families where domestic abuse is an issue.
- Identify the multi-professional roles in meeting the needs of children and families affected by domestic abuse.
- Understand local support and safeguarding procedures for those affected by domestic abuse and their children

Understanding Child Neglect in a Multi-agency Context

Neglect is the persistent failure to meet a child's basic physical and/or psychological needs, likely to result in the serious impairment of the child's health or development.

Part Two:

Contextual Safeguarding and Child on Child Abuse

Courses in this section of our programme seek to equip participants to understand and respond to the 'context' of where, when and how young people can experience significant harm beyond their families. It recognises that the different relationships young people form in their neighbourhoods, schools and online can feature violence and abuse.

Parents and carers may have little influence and insight into these contexts, and young people's experiences of abuse and exploitation outside the home can damage parent-child relationships.

Contextual Safeguarding, therefore, expands child protection beyond traditional sectors, to any professional and volunteer with influence and opportunities to address the abuse children experience beyond their front doors.

Awareness of Child Sexual and Criminal Exploitation (CSE & CCE)



FREE BRIEFING

Background

This is a briefing on child exploitation aimed at those working with children, young people and families who have no prior knowledge and only require introductory level information.

Learning Outcomes

Topics covered in the briefing:

- What is child exploitation?
- What are the signs/symptoms that a child or young person may be being exploited or at risk of being?
- What makes some children and young people more vulnerable than others to exploitation?
- What action should be taken if concerns are raised that child or young person is at risk?

Harmful Sexual Behaviours and the Brook Traffic Light Tool



Background Level 2

As children get older, the way they express their sexual feelings changes. Children and young people who develop harmful sexual behaviours (HSB) harm themselves and others. This course, delivered by Brook, aims to help professionals to identify HSB and respond appropriately.

It also supports attendees with how it applies in your unique setting, as well as helping you to develop an organisational approach to responding to sexual behaviours.

All delegates will receive a <u>Traffic Light Tool</u> booklet to support their learning and a pdf of the Tool, as well as access to a digital version of the Tool and certificate upon completion.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the training, participants will be able to:

- Identify: The behaviour and establish if it is: Typical or developmentally appropriate, problematic or harmful
- Understand: What the behaviour is communicating Why the child or young person may be exhibiting it
- Respond appropriately. This will depend upon: What's motivating the behaviour; the severity of the behaviour

Safeguarding Children in a Digital World



Level 2

Background

The online world opens up immense opportunities for children and young people. It is integral to modern day youth culture. It also, however, carries many threats. This course aims to equip staff with an understanding of what the risks are and how to prevent, recognise and respond to them.

Learning Outcomes

- Understand how to minimize the risk to children using technology
- Have an understanding of modern-day use of technology and the context in which children and young people use it
- Have developed an awareness of the risks involved

Understanding Serious Youth Violence, Gangs and the Criminal Exploitation of Children



Background

Young people in gangs are often vulnerable individuals who can be both perpetrators and victims of harm. Work is required to prevent children from joining gangs and to safeguard children already involved or at risk of exploitation

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the training, participants will:

- Have an improved understanding of child criminal exploitation (CCE) and serious group violence
- Identify the push/pull factors that make young people vulnerable to exploitation, violence and harmful group identity
- Understand the role social media plays in relation to either 'gangs' or group violence
- Be able to identify indicators at the earliest stages possible of involvement in harmful group activity and serious group violence
- Understand the issues around girls and CCE, including grooming, initiation and sexual exploitation

Part Three:



Responding to Local and National Priorities

This training series responds to local priorities as set out by the Redbridge Safeguarding Children Partnership.

Our priorities are influenced by local Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews (CSPR), an independent review conducted when a child living in Redbridge has died or been seriously harmed due to suspected abuse or neglect. The purpose is to identify lessons learned, how those lessons will be applied, and what changes are needed to improve inter-agency working and better safeguard children.

The Child Safeguarding Review Panel of England decides which serious safeguarding cases warrant a national review, based on their complexity or national significance. These reports explore systemic and structural issues within the safeguarding system. The goal is to generate lessons from these reviews that can be applied across the country to improve safeguarding and protect children.

Two of these recent influential reports from the Panel will receive particular attention this year:

- <u>"I wanted them all to notice", Protecting children and responding to child sexual abuse</u> <u>within the family environment</u>
- "It's Silent": Race, racism and safeguarding children

Children, Mental Health and Everyday Conversations

Background

Conversations with children safeguard their mental health by creating safe spaces to discuss feelings, normalising emotional expression, and boosting confidence and resilience

This multi-disciplinary course, will enable participants from a wide range of backgrounds to consider how, through their role; they can support and promote the mental health and wellbeing of children and young people

Introducing the Sunrise Hub: Supporting the health and recovery of children affected by sexual abuse



FREE TRAINING

Background

The <u>Independent Inquiry on Child Sexual Abuse</u> has heard from victims and survivors of the psychological and physical effects on well-being, family and intimate relationships, faith, and education and career. For some victims and survivors these effects endure throughout adult life.



Safer Recruitment



Background

Understanding Thresholds and Making Referrals



Background

Department for Education (DfE) research into Serious Case Reviews identified that 'thresholds' for intervention can vary between agencies; differences in perceived thresholds can lead to frustration or breakdown in effective working, resulting in children falling through the gaps or their needs not being met. Reports have also emphasised the importance of supporting professionals with their duty to escalate concerns.

In Redbridge, the London Safeguarding Children Partnership's multi-agency document, <u>Threshold -Continuum of Need Matrix</u>, sets out the thresholds for referral for use by all agencies and professionals who are worried or concerned about a child's safety or welfare. This course aims to support front-line workers and managers in its use. The course will also refer to the RSCP's <u>Resolution and Escalation Policy</u>, which aims to promote a culture of partnerships, working by supporting professionals to address differences in professional judgements around the response to the safety and wellbeing of children and young people.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the training, participants will:

- Be able to describe and understand the 'levels of need' that will be applied to determine whether the child and family can be appropriately and safely helped by early intervention and family support services.
- Have discussed indicators of different kinds of risk within these levels.
- Know how to access services for children with different levels of need effectively, and what kind of response can be expected.


